

WHAT: Town Of Wainwright 1st Avenue Improvements
WHEN: July 2nd, 2024, to September 30th, 2024
WHERE: 1st Avenue, from 1st Street to 8th Street

- On behalf of the Town of Wainwright, Hamm Construction is slated to commence operations on 1st Avenue, extending from the 1st Street off-ramp to 8th Street. Hamm Construction's focus will be on conducting sanitary upgrades. Following sanitary upgrades, Border Paving will undertake road resurfacing. Hamm Construction's and Border Paving's scopes of work will necessitate road closures beginning on **July 2nd, 2024** with full access anticipated to be reinstated by **September 30th, 2024**.

During this project

- Once construction begins, the intersection and roadway will be closed, and detours implemented.
- Work will be phased to minimize disruptions to the area for businesses and residents.
- Temporary access will be provided once base gravel is laid in certain stretches.
- Below is the **tentative schedule** for the work, barring weather delays and unforeseen circumstances:
 - **Beginning - July 2nd, 2024**
 - **Ending - September 30th, 2024**
- Once work begins on each phase, heavy equipment will be required to complete this work. Some noise and vibration are anticipated.
- During our 10-day shift, our working hours will be from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM. A detailed shift schedule can be provided if requested.

How you can help

- Follow posted traffic detours.
- Respect posted signs and barricades.
- Anticipate delays or changes in traffic patterns due to construction activities and plan your routes accordingly.
- Stay clear of the work zone for your safety and the safety of workers.
